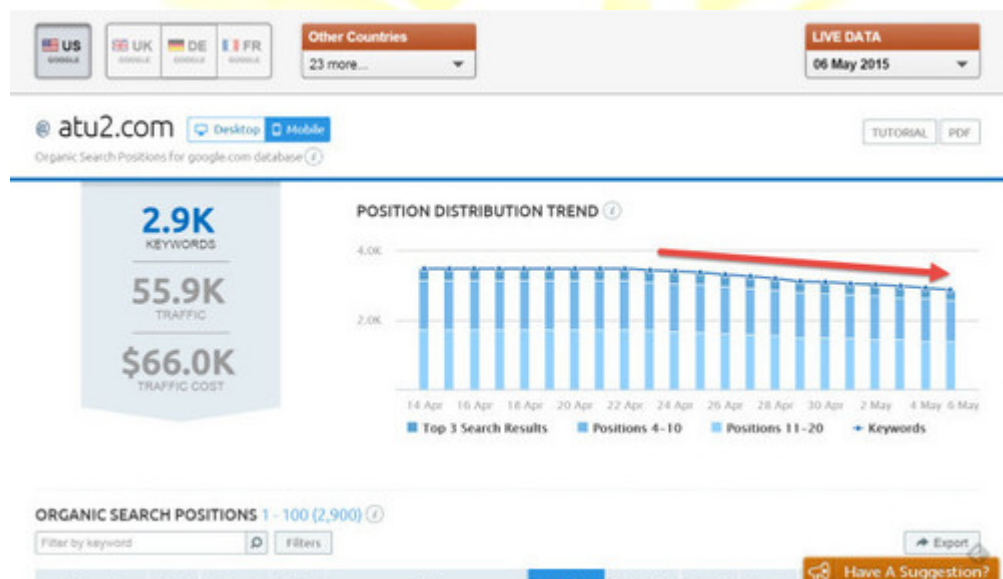
Google Takes On Mobile Rankings
