If you have a spare seven minutes, take a look at this TedTalk video from YouTube's Trend Manager, Kevin Allocca.


With over **48 hours** of video uploaded to YouTube every **minute**, Kevin identifies three characteristics of those videos that go viral and get over one million views. They are:




- Tastemakers / Influencers (people who kick-start the viral trend)
